It's in living a life of prayer, in constant communication with God, that the Son of Man will find faith in us when He comes.

An Article From Our Pastor

Dear Friends in Christ,

As I write this article crazy early before printing, on October 8th, I sit in the living room of a rental apartment in Atrani, a stone's throw from Amalfi. I wish I could print a picture here! This is a gorgeous area on Italy's famous Amalfi coast. The rocky cliffs drop into the sea, little towns cling to those cliffs or are built into large gullies, shall we say, that lead down more gently to the water. Atrani comes down to a nice beach; Praiano, which I braved riding to today on the back of a scooter driven by my brother Dominic (it actually was not too bad... and was the first I ever rode on one during all my years in Italy!), is much more the cling-to-the-cliff type of place. Anyway, in Amalfi, there is the cathedral of St. Andrew (a real cathedral, unlike ours, which has only a nickname). In the cathedral of St. Andrew is kept the precious relic of the skull of St. Andrew the Apostle. It kind of amazes me how so many relics have been gathered up in out of the way bergs. In Spoleto, you find one of the nails that held Jesus to the Cross. In Manoppello, you find the face cloth that covered Jesus' face when He slept in death in the tomb. In Assisi (popular, to be sure, but nevertheless out of the way), you find not only the tombs of St. Francis and St. Clare, but also now the relics of the newly-canonized St. Carlo Acutis. And in Amalfi, behold: the skull of St. Andrew. You are getting the idea!

In tiny little Atrani, the parish church is dedicated to St. Mary Magdalene. I visited it today with one of my sisters. It is not very large, but it is loaded with beautiful marble. The high altar is interlaid marble of different colors from floor to ceiling practically. There are multiple paintings involving St. Mary Magdalene in different areas, including one the high altar frames (kind of like how the high altar in our St. Andrew frames the stained glass window of St. Andrew). There is a simple inscription on the ceiling, about where the sanctuary begins, if my memory serves me. Anyway, it simply says: "Dilexit multum." In English: "She loved much." That really struck me. Those are two deeply meaningful words that sum up St. Mary Magdalene's turned-around, converted, penitent life.

Friends, how much do we love God? How much do we love our neighbor? Are we deeply converted, turned-around, repentant and penitent? Are we ready to give our whole lives for love of God, as did our patron the apostle and martyr St. Andrew? Are our hearts ready to be wounded with an arrow of divine Love like that of St. Theresa of Jesus, patroness of our parish in Theresa? Or how about having them be expanded by God as was the heart of St. Philip Neri (buried in Rome!), which if I recall correctly broke multiple ribs when God expanded his heart both mystically and physically? Thus did it become more like the Sacred Heart of Jesus, as should ours.

"By this all men will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another" (Jn. 13:35). One of my fears is that our love (the love of the Catholic Christian community) is not known. The fact that it is not well-known makes me wonder how much it actually exists at all. Now, let's not be creepy, haha, but our love for both God and neighbor should be known in holy, deep, pure and yes visible ways! Read about St. Mary Magdalene's love in the Scriptures (Luke 7, for example). It was visible, radical, pure and unashamed. Take a look at St. Philip Neri's love, which drove him to be a new apostle urging the people of Rome to come to God. How about St. Andrew, who boldly brought others to Jesus, beginning with his own brother Simon, and ultimately made the supreme witness of love and faith on the X-shaped cross? In our own day, St. Carlo Acutis strove to bring others to love and adore Jesus, really present in the Sacrament of His love. Deep, visible, obvious and true love for God marks the lives of all the saints of every age.

The saints are not only people of the "old days," they are to be people of our days, they are to include each of us! We have a wonderful opportunity this week to put God and His love first in our lives, and grow in our love for Him: the Forty Hours devotion at St. Mary in Lomira. There is a signup link (also found via a spiffy QR code!) in our bulletins, and posted around in our churches. To those who have signed up already: thank you! To those who have not: please do! We need around-the-clock adorers from Wednesday to Friday evenings. This is a privileged opportunity to receive our Lord's divine and personal love for each of us, and to grow in love for Him in return.

Tomorrow (from the perspective of when I am writing), I will be able to offer Holy Mass in the Cathedral of St. Andrew and pray before his skull. All of my parishioners will be prayed for in the memento of the living in the Roman canon. It will be a beautiful moment in the last full day of this Jubilee year pilgrimage.
