Article From Our Pastor

Dear Friends in Christ,

Be glad! Lent is more than half over. Let us keep running the race to a strong finish, buoyed up and transformed by the grace of God!

A wonderful opportunity for that transformation and renewal in Christ is available to us on April 9th, the day of 12 Hours of Reconciliation (and reparation and fasting for when we have failed to be signs of hope to others) in the Archdiocese. Individual confessions will be heard from at least 8am to 8pm in a church in each deanery. Holy Family in Fond du Lac is one site, St. Peter in Slinger is another.

Here is a quick catechetical review. :) All of our sins (committed up to that moment) are forgiven in the sacrament of Baptism. The only ordinary way any mortal sin committed after Baptism is forgiven is via the sacrament of Reconciliation. What is mortal sin? It is sin that meets three conditions: a grave matter, done with full knowledge and full free consent of our will. Grave matter is not always easy to discern, so we do our best. If we are wondering, err on the side of bringing it to confession! :) Our Lord wants to set us free. Examples include missing Mass on Sundays and holy days of obligation without a serious reason, sexual sin, serious gossip (in truth, a form of killing a person!), receiving the Holy Eucharist while already in a state of mortal sin, etc. This is not an exhaustive list by any means. See 1 Cor 6:9-11 for one (not the only) list in Sacred Scripture. The lists in Scripture give us a good place to start without themselves being exhaustive.

So, to make a good (meaning **valid!**) confession, the Church requires us to do the following: from our last good confession (or baptism, as the case may be), examine our conscience and to the best of our ability and memory confess **any and all** mortal sins we are aware of in kind and number. That means “what it was” and “how many times (as best we can recall) I did it.” Obviously, we must also have a repentant heart, and resolve by the grace of God not to commit these sins again. We are recommended, but not strictly required, to confess venial sins. We know we are beset by human weakness, and speaking from my own experience in the spiritual struggle, we may well end up falling into the same sins again. We should not allow that possibility or reality to discourage us. But it must also not simply be our plan to go out and commit the same sins again. To do that would be a situation of not really repenting.

It is critical to pray, ask for the light of the Holy Spirit, and make our best examination of conscience and preparation for the sacrament of Reconciliation. Be not afraid! Let us show our wounded, broken, sinful selves to the only One who can heal and redeem us: Jesus Christ! He bled and died and rose to save us. He loves us more than we can imagine! He will hold our broken, tender hearts in hands of love. It is to Him that ultimately we make our confession. His priest acts in His person. The priest is a broken, sinful instrument of the perfect mercy and love of our perfect God. Let not the brokenness, folly and sins of priests keep us away from our merciful Jesus! We come to the broken, sinful priest to obtain **God’s** forgiveness **because that is what our Lord Himself asks us to do**. He gave His own authority to forgive sins to His apostles (the first priests/bishops) and not to others of His disciples, not even His own perfect Mother. People say: I will confess my sins straight to God; I don’t need the sacrament of confession. We can indeed and should confess our sins straight to God (for example, as we examine our consciences at the end of the day), however, **to obtain God’s forgiveness**, our Lord asks us to humble ourselves and go about things in His way, and that way is the sacrament of reconciliation.
